Threads of Commitment: Roger Bauman & Elmer Brubacher's Legacy at the Charity Auction







For Roger Bauman and Elmer Brubacher, the Charity Auction is far more than a fundraising event; it's a living testament to community spirit, volunteerism, and the power of shared purpose.

A Journey of Service

Roger Bauman, current chair of the auction committee, has been involved with the auction for 13 years. His journey began with simple tasks such as helping with setup and logistics, but quickly grew into deeper involvement, particularly in canvassing for donations. "It can be time-consuming," Roger admits, "but it's worth it when you see manufacturers and community members give their products to support the cause."

Elmer Brubacher, who chaired the committee for a decade and was involved for nearly 27 years, shares a similar story of gradual immersion. "The first two years we helped with displaying quilts," he recalls. "Then for about 15 years, we served on the committee, and for the last 10, I was chair." His leadership included organizing meetings, coordinating volunteers, and introducing new fundraising ideas like the Friday night beef brisket dinner in 2014. "We were always looking for ways to raise more funds," he says. "In 2015, we hit \$100,000 for the first time. And in 2023, our 50th anniversary, we raised over \$128,000. That was our best year."

Leadership Through Change

Both Roger and Elmer navigated significant transitions with the COVID-19 pandemic posing one of the greatest challenges. "We didn't know how to proceed," Roger says, "but we adapted, and going online with the sale actually brought some improvements." Elmer agrees, noting that the shift helped streamline operations. "We had good results from a negative environment," he reflects.

Venue Challenges & Triumphs

Securing a venue has long been a logistical hurdle. Elmer recalls moving from Raceway Paddock, Lions Hall, Riverdale Poultry Express, and eventually the Elmira Produce Auction Cooperative (EPAC). "Each move brought new opportunities," he says. Roger adds that EPAC has provided much-needed stability, allowing the team to focus more on growth and outreach.

Both praised the generosity of venue hosts, many of whom donated space or charged minimal fees. "That kind of support makes a huge difference," Elmer notes.

QUILTS, COMMUNITY & FUTURE ASPIRATIONS

Quilts have long been a cherished centerpiece of the auction, with beautifully handcrafted pieces generously donated by the local community—often created with love and care, without expectation of reimbursement. Elmer hopes that younger generations can fully appreciate the artistry and tradition behind these quilts. "There's an opportunity to reintroduce their value," he says, noting that with thoughtful outreach and storytelling, the legacy of quilt-making can continue to inspire and engage new audiences.

Roger, meanwhile, hopes to see broader community involvement. "I still meet people who've never heard of the auction," he says. "We need to do more to make it a recognized event." He also emphasizes the importance of rekindling the spirit of giving. "We need to refocus on why we're here: to support Elmira District Community Living and connect as a community."

Marketing and communications efforts are now exploring ways to expand the auction's appeal, especially to younger audiences. Elmer, though retired from his formal role, remained involved in 2023 to support new leadership, underscoring his enduring commitment

A Shared Vision

Together, Roger and Elmer represent the past, present, and future of the Charity Auction. Their leadership, adaptability, and unwavering dedication have shaped the event into a cornerstone of Elmira's community life. Whether through quilts, brisket dinners, or online innovations, their vision remains clear: an inclusive, vibrant auction that reflects the generosity and spirit of Elmira that will grow for generations to come.

Save the Date - 2025 Charity Auction

The 52nd edition of the auction will be held on Friday October 24th and Saturday 25th at the Elmira Produce Auction Cooperative (EPAC) on 7400 Reid Woods Drive, Elmira. The signature Beef Brisket dinner will be held on the Friday, with the bake table and auction held on the Saturday. The committee is hoping to surpass last year's highlights: 253 bidders with over \$107,000 raised.




